**DECLARATION OF SAMUEL LONDONO
PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. § 1746**

I, SAMUEL LONDONO, hereby declare and state the following pursuant to 28

U.S.C. § 1746:

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1. I am an attorney at U.S. Southern Command (“SouthCom”). I oversee SouthCom’s Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”) program. I make the following declaration based upon personal knowledge.

ADDITIONAL ELECTRONIC SEARCH

2. In addition to previous electronic and physical searches as described in my declarations, dated April 2, 2019 and May 28, 2019, additional electronic searches were conducted between June 12, 2019 and June 24, 2019.

3. My office directed the SouthCom J2 (intelligence directorate), J3 (operations directorate), J5 (strategy, policy, and plans directorate) and the Security Cooperation Office El Salvador to conduct additional electronic searches using the search terms provided in the Order Granting Plaintiffs’ Motion to Compel, dated June 7, 2019:

- FOIA Request: 185D: “Bellosa,” SC 17-017-S;
- FOIA Request: 191D: “Molina” OR “Cabrera” OR “Melara” OR “Portillo” OR “Grijalba” OR Perez” OR “Salazar” OR “Rodriguez” OR “Jimenez,” SC 17-031-S;
- FOIA Request: 198D: “Mozote,” SC 17-034-S;
- FOIA Request: 180D: “Sumpul” OR “Chalatenango,” SC 17-008-S;
- FOIA Request: 200D: “Garcia” AND “Minister,” SC 17-079-S;
- FOIA Request: 220D: “Morazan,” SC 17-102-S;
- FOIA Request: 218D: “Monterrosa,” SC 17-100-S; and
- FOIA Request: 171D: “Atlatatl,” SC 16-049-S.

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4. The searches for responsive documents were conducted on the following platforms: Sharepoint, Secret Internet Protocol Router Network, Non-secure Internet Protocol Router, and Joint Worldwide Intelligence Communications System. No responsive documents were found.

CONTACT OF FORMER EMPLOYEES

5. To help ascertain the physical location of potential responsive documents, SouthCom contacted two former SouthCom historians, Dr. John Pitts and Dr. Bradley Coleman. These two former employees were contacted because, as historians, they would have been involved in records management and, more importantly, would know about previous SouthCom operations and activities.

6. Dr. John Pitts served as SouthCom's first Historian from 1991 to 2005. On May 30, 2019, Dr. Pitts informed SouthCom via email that prior to 1991 records disposition was handled by the U.S. Army. Notwithstanding this, Dr. Pitts took it upon himself to assume and execute records management functions for SouthCom.

7. In this capacity, Dr. Pitts visited the Washington National Records Center; the U.S. Army Center for Military History; the Naval Historic Center; the Marine Corps Historical; the Office of the Secretary of Defense Historian; and the Joint Chiefs of Staff Joint History Office to identify SouthCom-relevant documents. With the exception of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Joint History Office, Dr. Pitts did not find any SouthCom documents at any of these locations. At the Joint Chiefs of Staff Joint History Office, Dr. Pitts did find SouthCom documents. He brought a selection of those documents back to

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SouthCom. Additional details, to include the location of those documents—assuming they still exist—are unknown.

8. Dr. Pitts also mentioned that after SouthCom moved from Panama to Florida (in the late 1990s), records management changed. Information was now produced and stored electronically, which made records management a lot easier.

9. Finally, Dr. Pitts explained there was no Department of Defense-level policy that governed records management, to include disposition, during his time at SouthCom. Dr. Pitts said there were a series of high-level meetings from 2000 to 2001 regarding establishing a policy but, after the terrorist attacks of September 11th, the meetings discontinued.

10. Dr. Bradley Coleman served as SouthCom's Historian from 2006 to 2011. Dr. Coleman was unaware of the location of any responsive documents. He recommend that we contact Dr. Pitts and the U.S. Army Center for Military History (CMH), as they could have more information. As provided in my April 2, 2019 declaration, the archivist at the U.S. Army Center of Military History confirmed they did not have responsive records.

11. Unfortunately, these former employees did not illuminate the possible location of responsive records. Nevertheless, contacting them was helpful. For one, Dr. Pitt's input helps explain why it is unlikely that we would have physical records that are responsive to the Plaintiffs' FOIA requests. Secondly, Dr. Coleman, who was the historian until 2011, confirmed that he was unaware of any physical records that would be responsive to the FOIA requests. As the then-historian, he would have been in the best position to know whether these documents existed and, if so, their location.

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3 **INACTIVE STORAGE FACILITIES**

4 12. With the exception of four instances, SouthCom has used the Washington
5 National Records Center as its inactive storage facility. In the four instances, documents
6 were sent to the Philadelphia Federal Records Center.
7

8 13. Based on the information provided to us by the Washington National Records
9 Center, it appears that only the Washington National Records Center would have
10 documents created from 1980 to 1982. In the four instances we used the Philadelphia
11 Federal Records center, two of the instances were to store records from our Security
12 Cooperation Office in Ecuador. (These documents appear to include foreign training and
13 U.S. personnel records.) In the other two instances, the documents are categorized as
14 logistics acquisitions or "BX 1" and were sent by a previous records manager in 2015.
15
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17 **SF-115s and SF-135s**

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19 14. SouthCom tasked the SouthCom enterprise to search for SF-135s and SF-115s.
20 Physical and electronic searches were conducted, to include across each of the electronic
21 platforms used at SouthCom.
22

23 15. The search produced twelve SF-135s, all from our historian's and records
24 manager's office. (These twelve SF-135s were previously located and produced by one of
25 our historians.) No SF-115 was located.
26

27 16. Separately, at our request, the Washington National Records Center sent us all
28 the SouthCom SF-135s they had in their possession. They provided seven SF-135s.

17. Of the 19 SF-135s located, only three SF-135s reference documents possibly
created between 1980 and 1982.

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3 a. SF-135 (Accession Number 335/01/0006/15). This SF-135 contains
4 records related to the Panama Canal Treaties of 1977 and one of the boxes—under
5 the general heading, “International Treaties”, is titled, “Files 1976-1986.”
6

7 b. SF-135 (Accession Number 530/12/0011/4). This SF-135 does not
8 identify any document as being created between 1980 and 1982. It does, however,
9 in pen, identify an estimate range (presumably of documents) from 1980 to 2009.
10 The documents, mostly from the 1990s and 2000s, include command histories,
11 country files on forward operating locations, Plan Colombia, counter drug reports
12 used from 2002 to 2006, speeches and testimony, and trip reports from 2004 to
13 2008. It also has files regarding SouthCom’s relocation (presumably to Florida).
14 Based on the accession number, it seems that these files were sent in 2012. The
15 SF-135 does not make any reference to El Salvador.
16

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18 c. SF-135 (Accession Number 530/97/0004/5). This is the SF-135 we used
19 to retrieve the two boxes from the Washington National Records Center, which,
20 per the Order Granting Plaintiffs’ Motion to Compel, is provided. It identifies two
21 boxes, which are the ones we retrieved and searched, as having documents
22 produced between 1980 and 1982.
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25 18. Since the SF-135s do not identify documents that may reasonably be
26 responsive to Plaintiffs’ FOA requests, SouthCom did not recall additional boxes from
27 the Washington National Records Center.
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I hereby declare under the penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
